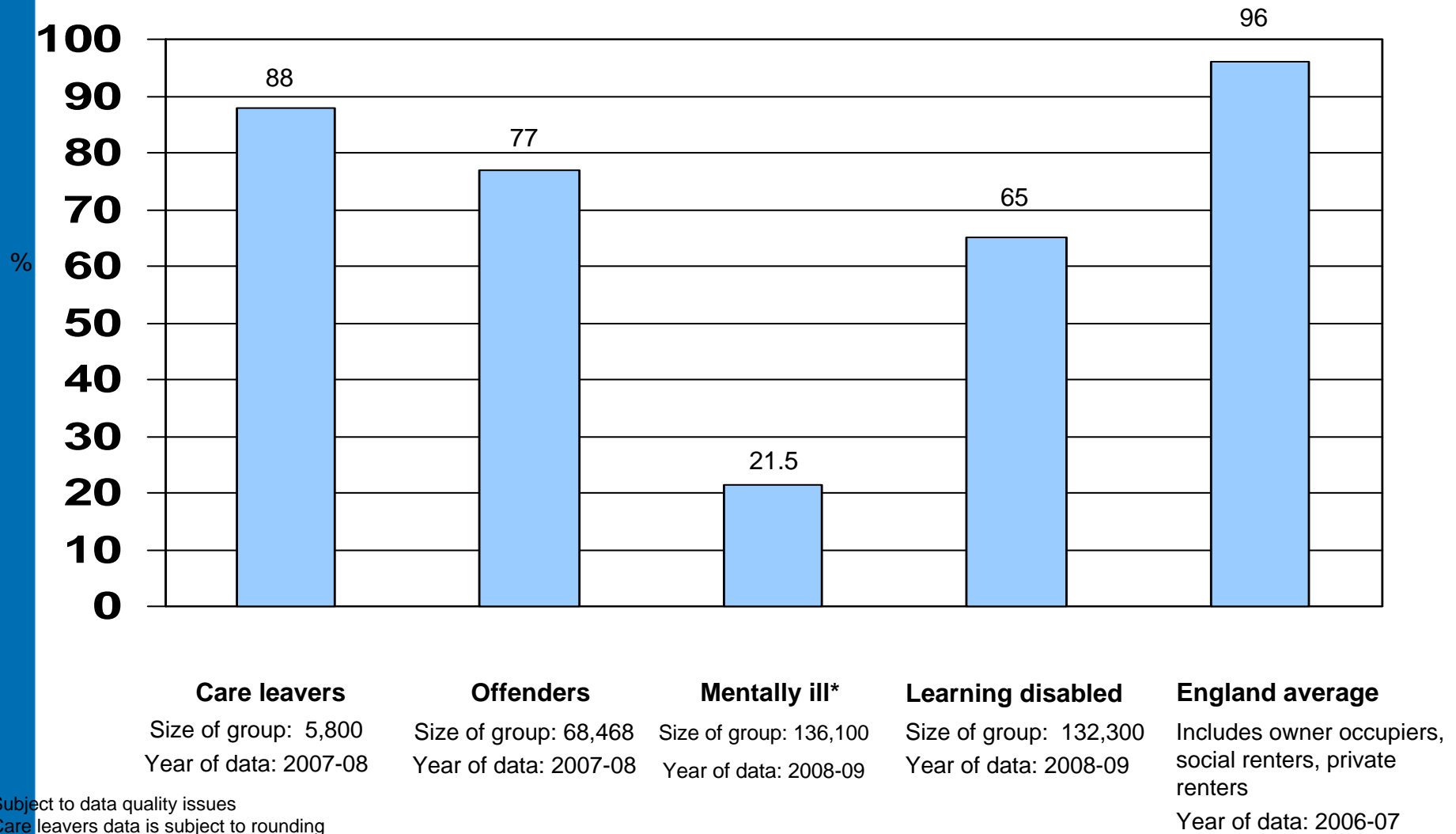

To ensure that the most socially excluded adults are offered the chance to get back on a path to a more successful life, by increasing the proportion who are in settled accommodation and in employment, education or training

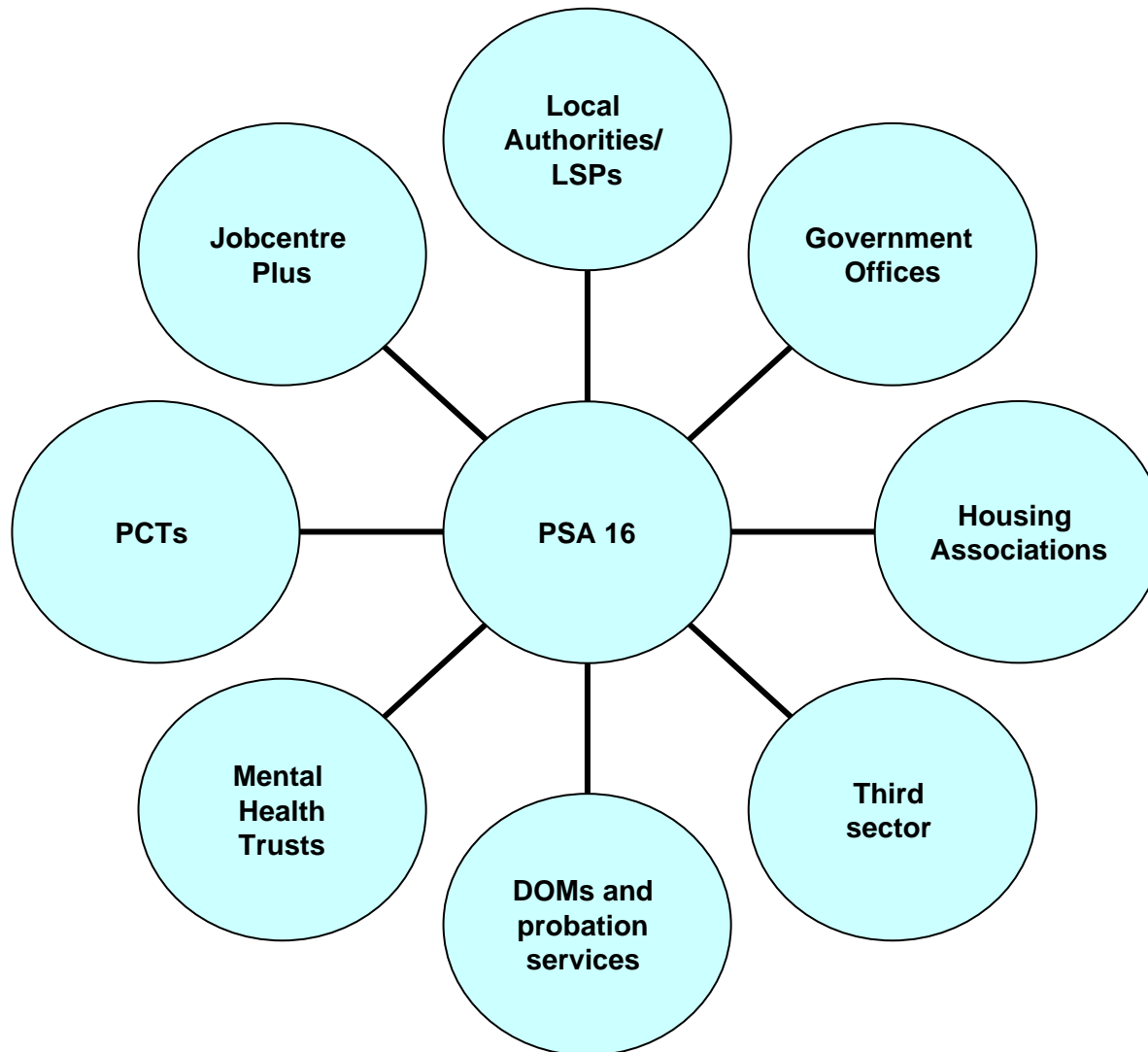
A home for socially excluded adults: the challenge
